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Referring to Good News, Item 7.2, Chair McDougald congratulated the Communications department for their work on a comprehensive communications campaign to support the updated Health and Physical Education curriculum. She noted that Peel DSB was one of only seven Gold Medallion Award winners from across North America. Chair McDougald also commended the students who received the CFUW University Entrance Awards and Dean's List Award, on their achievements.

A trustee spoke to Item 7.3, Copy of a letter to the Minister of Education from the Chair of Thames Valley District School Board requesting that the Ministry of Education add coding to the Ontario Curriculum in Grades JK to 8. She asked that this Item be referred to the June 15, 2016 Regular Meeting of the Board, pending staff input with regard to supporting this goal.

8. Delegation by Bilal Choudry re Exemption from the Exemption Policy for Enrolment in Grade 1 French Immersion

Bilal Choudry thanked the Chair for the opportunity to delegate for his son to be exempted from the French Immersion (FI) randomized selection process and to present his reasons for his request. Using a PowerPoint presentation and speaking notes that were given to the administration prior to the delegation, Bilal Choudry provided background information regarding changes in his job, resulting in his family relocating from Quebec to Ontario, and some information on his son who is currently at Willow Way Public School. He reviewed the Board's policy for exemption from randomized selection and highlighted that the policy specifically states that students who have moved from a jurisdiction where French was the language of instruction in Kindergarten will qualify for exemption. Bilal Choudry expressed his belief that this clause in the policy should apply to his son, as the family had moved to Peel from the province of Quebec. He stated that his son is currently on the waitlist for Grade 1 FI at Vista Heights Public School.

Responding to a trustee's question as to whether the pre-kindergarten program attended by his son in Quebec is officially part of Quebec's education system, Bilal Choudry clarified that it is outside of Quebec's education system. He added that it is a bilingual program which is part of a government-subsidized program and includes grammar, vocabulary and conversation, with instruction in French. Chair McDougald thanked the delegation and advised that a response will be brought to the next Regular Meeting of the Board on June 15, 2016.

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10. Appointment of Two Trustees to French Immersion Review Committee - Elementary

At the Regular Meeting of the Board, held May 25, 2016, the Board approved the re-establishment of a French Immersion Review Committee – Elementary, and received notice to appoint two trustees to the Committee.

Chair McDougald called for nominations.

Trustee Andrews nominated Trustee McDonald

There were no further nominations. Chair McDougald declared that Trustees Lawton and McDonald are appointed to the French Immersion Review Committee - Elementary.

11. 2016 – 2017 Budget: Introduction - Chair's Remarks

Chair McDougald reported that once again this year, there was a smooth and collaborative budget process, with preparation that began months ago, and staff and trustees worked together to develop the 2016-2017 budget. She expressed pleasure that the Board has remained steadfast in its focus on student success, setting budget priorities that put students first. She explained the budget process which comprised of a business case review, that allowed the Board to respond to new and emerging system and school priorities, as well as a consultation process that included representation from employee groups, principals and vice-principals, senior leadership, and trustees.

Chair McDougald thanked Director of Education, Tony Pontes, Associate Directors Jaspal Gill and Scott Moreash, Controller of Finance Support Services, Tania Alatishe-Charles and staff of the Finance Department, for their diligence, guidance and collaboration during the budget process. She stated that input from staff, parents, school council members, students, and community, by way of an online survey, included the community's requests for increased funding for special education, technology, classroom resources, extra-curricular activities, facility upgrades, and transportation. Chair McDougald advised that most of the budget of \$ 1.77 billion for 2016-2017 is allocated to operational costs of salaries, benefits, busing, classroom resources, technology, maintenance, utilities and day-to-day costs. The balance of \$ 4.3 million, and \$ 2.4 million from Board reserves, will be used for enhancements in special education supports, increase in number of teaching assistants, increased busing for students, extra-curricular activities, and additional staffing. Other enhancements will include digital tablets for custodial and maintenance staff, improvement of facilities to support program needs, and additional resources for Kindergarten classrooms. Chair McDougald expressed her support for the 2016-2017 budget which focuses on projects in the Report Card for Student Success. She acknowledged the work of Peel staff and volunteers in supporting Peel schools and the Board's mission statement, to inspire success, confidence and hope in each student.

12. 2016 – 2017 Budget: Director’s Report

Director of Education, Tony Pontes, echoed Chair McDougald’s positive comments on the budget which supports student success. He expressed pride in the level of consultation that takes place to improve Peel’s budget through a consultation process which includes employee group representatives, principals and vice-principals, senior leadership, and trustees. He noted that this year, input was also invited from staff, parents, school councils, students, and community members through an online survey. He thanked the Communications department and the many respondents who participated in the survey and advised that the feedback has been reflected in the balanced budget.

Using PowerPoint slides, Director Pontes summarized the feedback received with regard to staffing, special education, technology, classroom resources, extra-curricular activities, transportation, class size and facilities. He stated that the Board has set aside \$15 million for improvement of school playgrounds and fields and continues to look for partnerships to support program needs. He advised that class sizes cannot be reduced as they are mandated by the government. Director Pontes commented that in spite of the increase in High Needs Amount funding for the next four years, Peel continues to be overspent in the special education budget. He expressed hope that the government will review how they fund special education. Director Pontes stated that the Ministry uses outdated census data to calculate funding, and noted that using current data will assist in more accurate funding. He thanked everyone involved in developing this budget.

13. 2016 – 2017 Budget Overview

Associate Director of Operational Support Services, Jaspal Gill, thanked the Finance department for their work on the development of the Budget document. Using a slide presentation, Associate Director Gill provided an overview of enrolment trends over the past twelve years, noting that most of the funding is based on student enrolment and Average Daily Enrolment (ADE). He reviewed provincial funding changes for the 2016-2017 school year, indicating that funding for publicly funded education in Ontario is expected to increase by \$300 million. Jaspal Gill outlined the budget development approach which is based on consultation with trustees, senior administration, school staff, and community. He highlighted some of the 2016-2017 budget enhancements which include: a coordinating principal for First Nations, Métis and Inuit equity program; \$ 950,000 to reduce busing distance eligibility for Grades 7 and 8 students; additional teaching assistants, a psychologist, social worker and speech-language pathologist; adding ESL and resource teachers; more resources for the Early Years program; funding for staff training to implement cashless initiative in schools; adding a PC LAN specialist; technology for custodial and maintenance staff; additional \$ 600,000 for utilities, and \$15 million to improve facilities for program needs. With regard to Special Education funding, Jaspal Gill explained the 5-year funding shortfall estimates from 2012-2013 to 2016-2017. He noted that although the Ministry introduced a new method for calculating funding to be implemented over a 4-year period starting in 2014-2015, Peel DSB continues to see a shortfall in special education funding of \$4.3 million for 2016-2017.

14. Budget Motions (Continued)

A trustee thanked the Director’s Office, Finance Support Services, trustees, and staff who worked on the 2016-2017 proposed budget. Supporting the proposed budget, particularly in the area of funds allocated to busing of Grades 7 and 8 students to align with the coterminous board, he commented on the benefits of encouraging more children to walk or bike to school in the future, once transportation levels are consistent between the two boards. While he expressed pleasure on the provision for one additional staff included in the budget for First Nations Métis and Inuit/Equity (FNMI), he suggested that more money could have been allocated for FNMI, to support continued voluntary self-identification and education of all students about Treaty Rights, Truth and Reconciliation, and native culture.

Trustees speaking echoed the sentiments of other board members with regard to staff’s hard work that went towards presenting a balanced budget, and the decision to harmonize busing distances for grades 7 and 8 students with the coterminous board, in response to the community’s request, to be equitable to all students in the region, and to assist in retaining Peel students. A trustee commented on the possibility of declining enrolment and recalled that the Student Attract and Retain report had identified that transportation was important to the community. However, she stated that dedicating approximately 25% of the discretionary funds available to reduce walking distance is not, in her opinion, fiscal responsibility or equity. She spoke about funding priorities and noted that Ministry changes to Intensive Behavioural Intervention (IBI) funding will also significantly impact the education system, as school boards will have to assume the costs for providing services that were previously provided by social service partners.

A student trustee expressed appreciation for the increased funding for extra-curricular activities, technology, busing, and mental health support in the budget. Expressing support for the proposed budget, a trustee highlighted the need for funding various programs to help students have more choices and funding for mental health issues. Vice-Chair Nurse commented that since 2006 this is the first time that community input has been invited in the budget process.

16. Comments or Questions from Board Members

Trustee Andrews shared information on numerous activities at Goldcrest Public School and a Funfair she had attended. The school participated in Ontario Physical and Health Education Association's Healthy School Certification Program. Students assessed 30 healthy initiatives and explored innovative ways to make the school better. Students were supported by school staff, Peel Public Health and Region of Peel. The school also won an EcoSchool Gold Award and the EcoSchool video challenge, placing second in Ontario.

Trustee Lawton spoke about a Syrian family event attended by some trustees, United Way, Peel DSB's We Welcome the World staff, and the Arabic Student Club from T. L. Kennedy Secondary School who volunteered time as translators. She reported that the families are feeling well supported.

Trustee McDonald commented positively on a concert that she attended last week at Sir Wilfrid Laurier Public School, 'From Violence to Violins', a program organized by violinist Moshe Hammer, who helps students to not only appreciate music, but turn away from violence and learn to play an instrument. The trustee also reported on the Kabaddi sporting event, a traditional South Asian sport in which many students participated. She thanked the Health and Physical Education staff for organizing the event.

Trustee McDonald inquired about Peel DSB's policy on concussion. She stated that there are a wide range of practices in different school boards. She inquired whether Peel's practices are in line with Ministry guidelines and asked about training for administration. Chair McDougald stated that Peel DSB's policy is consistent with government guidelines and requested that the trustee forward her question to Director Pontes for a more specific answer.

Trustee Singh reported that for the first time in North America and outside of Asia, a high school Kabaddi tournament was organized at the Powerade Centre in Brampton on June 1, 2016. He thanked Superintendent of Curriculum and Instruction Support Services, Poleen Grewal, Resource Teacher, John Uren, and staff of Louise Arbour Secondary School, Principal Sharron Kuhl, Greg Cappuccitti and Leigh Hanna for taking a leadership role in ensuring that this event was a success. He also commended the work done by the volunteers and coaches.

Catherine Soplet asked for an update on her request made at the last Regular Meeting of the Board with regard to 2015-2016 Regional Parents Reaching Out (PRO) grant accessed by the United Achievers Club of Brampton to provide workshops. She also thanked the Board for the budget which supports extra-curricular activities, busing for students, making sure students are supported, and engaging parents in the community. Chair McDougald responded.
