## 3. Special Presentation by the Winners of the 2014 Excellence in Eloquence Competition

Chair McDougald stated that this year marks the 14<sup>th</sup> anniversary of the Excellence in Eloquence Competition which was started in the year 2000 by Darwin Chan and Michael Dzis, two Grade 8 teachers in Peel. She thanked members of the Excellence in Eloquence Committee for their hard work and support over the years, and the staff and parents for their dedication to students. She congratulated the winners and expressed appreciation for all the students who participated in this event. Chair McDougald stated that the tournament is a great addition to the Oral Communication section of the curriculum, and indicated that the winners receive a medal, a trophy and plaque for their school.

Adna Moalin, Ross Drive Public School student, and winner of the Junior Level, commenced her speech with a quote from Martin Luther King Jr., asking, "what are you doing for others?" She spoke about homelessness and the dire circumstances that homeless people find themselves in, commenting that such situations lead many to take refuge in drugs. Her message is for people to empathize with the condition of homeless people, and work towards building more shelters for them. Madison Lavery, SouthFields Village Public School student, and winner of the Intermediate level, spoke about the principles and values that are important to her, including hard work and gratitude, embracing new experiences, and being unafraid of making mistakes. She highlighted that happiness is loving what you have and being content with who you are.

Chair McDougald and Director of Education, Tony Pontes, presented tokens of appreciation to the winners.

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Speaking to Item 9.2, Good News, Fix the Formula Campaign, a trustee congratulated the Communications department, as well as the parents and school councils who worked hard to make this a positive campaign. She also acknowledged the work put in by the Chair of the Board towards the success of the campaign.

Highlighting Item 9.4, Crossing Guard Appreciation Day, a trustee expressed appreciation for the support provided by crossing guards to ensure the safety of students, and he encouraged trustees to visit their schools on June 9, 2015, to thank crossing guards for the service they provide.

**10. Delegation by David Laing re School Active Transportation Programs**

David Laing, a member of Bike Brampton, requested the Board's support in getting more children moving actively between home and school. Using a PowerPoint presentation, he displayed data showing that approximately 84% of pre-school children get 60 minutes of moderate to vigorous physical activity per day. However, this percentage decreases through middle and high school to about 4% of 12 to 17 year olds getting 60 minutes of physical activity. David Laing spoke of inactivity and studies linking it to heart and lung disease, Type II diabetes, and obesity. He then provided information on the positive results of activity, including academic performance, mental acuity, and a reduction of inattentive disruptive behaviour. He highlighted reduced traffic congestion and air pollution as a result of walking or biking. The delegation indicated the need for a cultural norm shift that encourages children to walk or bike to school, which, in the process, may contribute to positive behaviour and building good life-long habits. In response to the Chair's request about how Peel can help with this project, David Laing indicated the need for a collaborative approach with various stakeholders to ensure commitment and sustainability of the program.

Chair McDougald thanked the delegation and requested that a copy of his presentation be provided for further discussion. Director of Education, Tony Pontes, stated the need to involve Peel Health, who are focused on reducing obesity, and Peel Regional Police. He also indicated that this presentation would be useful for principals to show to their school councils, to garner interest and understanding from parents regarding the benefits of physical activity.

**11. Delegation by Aman Narang re Transportation to Meadowvale Village Public School**

Aman Narang delegated the Board regarding transportation to Meadowvale Village Public School. The delegation spoke from written notes which were later provided to the administration.

Aman Narang stated that parents had received a letter from Student Transportation of Peel Region (STOPR) indicating that busing will not be available to their children as of September 2015, as a result of an annual reassessment of walking routes in the area. He indicated that parents were not aware of the exception made for busing several years ago, even at the time their children were being enrolled. Aman Narang outlined concerns for the safety of children walking to school on Sombrero Way and Second Line, in the absence of sufficient safety measures. He also spoke of slippery conditions during winter and high traffic volume on Sombrero Way, as a result of the bridge becoming unusable due to the Highway 401 expansion project. In light of the above, the delegation requested the Board to reconsider STOPR's decision, and retain transportation for Meadowvale Village Public School's Grades 2 to 4 students until all safety measures are put in place.

Chair McDougald thanked the delegation for bringing his concerns forward, and indicated that a response will be provided at the next Regular Meeting of the Board.

**12. Delegation by Rajiv Sawhney and Vipul Purohit re Transportation to Meadowvale Village Public School**

Rajiv Sawhney, and Vipul Purohit, delegated the Board regarding transportation to Meadowvale Village Public School. The delegation spoke from written notes which were later handed over to the administration.

Rajiv Sawhney reported on the letter that parents received from STOPR regarding the termination of busing, effective September 2015, as a result of a reassessment of the walking routes in the area. He indicated that the walking route was explored by a group of parents, along with Trustee Crocker, and he stated that there were still some safety concerns noted with respect to the gradient on Sombrero Way, and on Second Line near the marshy area which has a guard rail, not a fence. He also explained that, due to Highway 401 expansion, the Second Line bridge will soon become unusable, resulting in heavier traffic along Sombrero Way. The delegation stated that Trustee Crocker had advised David Neale, Controller of Corporate Support Services, of safety concerns with the walking route. Rajiv Sawhney spoke about the exception made for busing several years ago which parents were unaware of at the time of admission to school. In view of the safety concerns expressed, he requested the Board to review STOPR's decision and continue transportation for students residing in the Sombrero Way subdivision.

Chair McDougald thanked the delegation and advised that a response will be provided at the next Regular Meeting of the Board.

He clarified the process for identifying candidates and selecting one parent for each trustee. He stated that if there is no candidate for a certain area, a candidate from another area will be assigned, although PIC will maintain original representation to the extent it is possible. Chair McDougald referred to the requirements of the Journey Ahead, and stated that all efforts will be made to ensure equity and an unbiased approach in relation to representation on the Committee. A trustee commented that the Parent Involvement Committee is a well-organized group of involved, and dedicated parents.
